
# What's behind a successful consultant?

- Understand the problem statement
  - Ask stupid questions if needed
  - Restate the problem and confirm that it's the the issue to work on
- Gather facts
  - Don't trust client's conclusions
    - Though, don't piss the client off with that!
  - Don't accept any excuses that something can't be done to collect diagnostics info
  - Get hands on; simulate if needed
- Keep diagnosing until it's clear what's going on
  - Verify diagnosis especially if "educated guess" is involved

# Stabbed at Costume Party in SF

# Unexpected Asystole

- Middle of cancer removal operation
- Suddenly flat line on the monitor
  - lead fallen off?
    - no -> the heart did indeed stop
  - started chest compression
  - asystole mid-operation? must be massive bleeding!
    - but there was none
  - lack of oxygen?
    - nop - tried oxygen at 100% & no lung problems
- Error - anesthesiologist has given 100 times higher dose of potassium



# Why Do We Fail?

- “Necessary fallibility” - some things are beyond our capacity (philosophers Gorovitz & MacIntyre)
- There are many realms where control is within our reach - build bridges & skyscrapers, stop heart attacks, cure stab wounds, solve Oracle performance problems. But we still fail...
  - IGNORANCE - we might only have partial understanding
  - INEPTITUDE - knowledge exists but we fail to apply it correctly
- Balance is shifting from failures driven by ignorance to failures caused by ineptitude.





# Facing the Unknown - Excuse For Guessing? (aka Educated Guess)

- Straightforward logic, top-down, deductive logic
  - We have general knowledge
  - No gaps in our understanding
  - Applying general knowledge to particular situation
  - Example - Method-R is all about deductive logic
- Inductive logic, bottom-up
  - We don't have enough general knowledge
  - We start with a particular observation
  - We formulate a hypothesis - new general theory
  - Next... deduction exercise to verify the new theory

# Paradigm Shift

- Earth as the center of the universe
  - Paradigm shift -> realization that neither Earth and not even the sun are the center of the universe
- Stephen Covey's story from The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People
  - Boys in the train gone wild
- Paradigm shift in database performance
  - "Optimizing Oracle Performance" by Cary Millsap and Jeff Holt.
- Lesson? Do regularly question general theory and...
- ... be prepared to fail!

## Story of Two Astronomers at Bell Labs


- It was too sensitive and picked up lots of noise


